- Introduced Emmaus's Concerning Him blog and podcasts.


We are excited about the direction of Emmaus and look forward to more forward movement! Thank you so much for praying with us for the work at Emmaus Bible College.


### **Ministry Breakdown**

## Operation Expenses: \$6,127,000


