#### **Year In Review: Planting Future Impact**

At commencement 2023 I spoke of transformational learning, rooted in biblical truth. Our strongest and greatest desires are to see our students transformed though their time here, and that transformation be rooted in biblical truth. We at Emmaus Bible College continue to work toward a strong future for the college, our students, and alumni. The following highlights a few of our many 2023 Fiscal Year accomplishments:

- Thanks to restricted project support from donors, nearly \$1 million
  was invested into multiple capital improvement projects around
  campus, including 30 new main building windows, updates to the
  library entrance and hallway, a refresh of Glock Auditorium, Pollard
  Fieldhouse updates, and needed electrical infrastructure upgrades.
- Administrative highlights include reaccreditation by the Higher Learning Commission and the launch of a new Strategic Plan.
- Global Campus enrollment in Spring 2023 was more than double 2022, and the full BS in Biblical Studies is now available online.

Please continue to pray with us for the college and the Lord's provisions, as we continue planting for the future, rooted in biblical truth.




## **Ministry Breakdown**


